LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY UPDATE

- 1. Legislature is scheduled to reconvene on January 11, 2017.
- In preparation, the League of Municipalities held its Advocacy Goals Conference on October 23, 2016.
 - 28 goals submitted, narrowed down to 15
 - 3 goals submitted by the League's Regulatory Action Committee (several UNRBA member jurisdictions have representatives on the RAC)



APPROVED GOALS OF INTEREST TO OUR MEMBERSHIP:

- Oppose legislation that interferes with local management or ownership of local assets.
- Seek legislation eliminating municipalities' repayment of water- and sewer- growth related fees that have been previously collected, and providing municipalities with the authority to assess the level of fees and charges necessary for continued growth and economic development in the future.
- Seek legislation to increase state-level funding for municipal infrastructure needs.
- Support legislation that recognizes that management of a public utility is best determined by the local owning entity due to their consideration of financing, engineering, and regulatory responsibilities.



RAC RECOMMENDED GOAL THAT DID NOT MAKE THE TOP 15:

Support solutions addressing established use impairments in waters that are based on current site-specific data and analysis, assign responsibility proportionate to the source, and equitably hold accountable all contributors.

There was some discussion of this goal when it was presented. Reinforced in my mind the importance of the need for education on the requirements of the CWA and the work that an organization like the UNRBA is doing.



3. HB44/SL2015-246 section 13—RESTRICTIONS ON BUFFERS

Key language:

Except as provided in this section, a local government may not enact, implement, or enforce a local government ordinance that establishes a riparian buffer requirement that exceeds riparian buffer requirements necessary to comply with or implement federal or State law or a condition of a permit, certificate, or other approval issued by a federal or State agency.



- The EMC Water Quality Committee inquired about compliance with the SL at its September 7, 2016 meeting.
- In response, DWR sent an e-mail to a number of local government jurisdictions, including Durham, inquiring how each jurisdiction planned to comply with the SL.
- City of Durham submitted a response on October 10, 2016 indicating that it would continue to enforce its buffer requirements as they are required by the City's Stormwater NPDES permit.
- Apparently, DEQ agrees with that position since it has informed at least one local government of the following:

Because the riparian buffer requirements implemented by your government are "necessary to comply with...a condition of a permit, certificate, or other approval issued by a federal or State agency," there is no reason for the EMC to take action pursuant to §143-214.23A(b).
